

Bernard Wu is a sole practitioner attorney in the Phoenix metropolitan area, licensed in Arizona, California and New Jersey, concentrating in the areas of commercial law and litigation, and personal injury. For eight years he was also a part-time instructor at Kaplan College teaching Commercial law. He is the Previous Past-President Chinese Chamber of Commerce of Arizona serving from 2012 to 2019 and was the former President of the Arizona Asian-American Bar Association (AAABA) in 2001 and the former President of the Arizona Asian-American Association (AAAA) in 2004 and 2005.

He had been active on three City of Phoenix commissions including the Chair of the Community Development Block Grant Committee (CDBG), the Pacific Rim Advisory Council (PRAC) and the City of Phoenix Public Defender Review Board (PDRB). Bernard currently sits on the Phoenix Police Department Asian Advisory Board.

Bernard is also legal counsel for the Phoenix Chapter of the Organization of Chinese Americans (OCA) and had served as counsel for ACEL formerly known as the National Association of Asian-American Professionals (NAAAP) and the Arizona chapter of the Asian Real Estate Association of America (AREAA). He sat on the Governor's Arizona Asian-Advisory Council from 2004 to 2008 and the Arizona Attorney General's Asian-American Committee from 2000 to 2006. He is a graduate of the FBI Citizens Academy and the Phoenix Police Citizens Academy.
